### **Transport Guidance**

When an activity or trip is taking place away from your usual meeting place, consideration will need to be given to how the children and young people will get there. If you are not providing transport, make sure parents or carers are aware of this and have given consent for their child or young person to take part and possibly travel alone.



#### If providing transport:

- Ensure that transport provided is suitable for the trip. Risk assessments can be used to ensure that all potential hazards have been identified and eliminated;
- Check that any paid staff and volunteers who may be using their own transport to carry children or young people have appropriate insurance cover, a valid driving licence, MOT certificate and road tax;
- If using extra voluntary helpers, ensure that all adequate and appropriate checks have been made; and
- Build in adequate rest breaks for the driver on long journeys and adequate supervision so that the driver is not distracted by young people.

#### Using a minibus

The legal requirements around minibus use are extremely complex and therefore cannot be explored in depth here. Consideration will need to be given to the following:

- Have you risk assessed the journey and minibus?
- Is the minibus correctly licensed and taxed?
- Does it have a valid MOT certificate?
- Is it well maintained?
- Insurance cover is it adequate and appropriate?
- Is the driver suitably qualified to drive the bus? Do they need a permit?
- Who is responsible for ensuring that seat belts are being worn?
- Is there a first aid box on the bus? Is it adequately supplied?

It is worth noting that if a person passed their test after 31st December 1996 there are additional restrictions in relation to driving minibuses unless the person has a D1 on their licence.

# **RoSPA Pre-Drive Safety Check**

Every day the minibus is used, the driver should conduct a pre-drive safety check. This should be repeated whenever another driver takes over the vehicle. He or she should walk around the vehicle, including the trailer if applicable, to check for visible defects, and check the items listed below:
